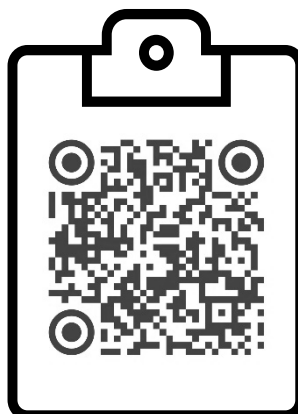

Civic Affairs Update >>>

Dallas City Council District 11 Results

Voters headed to the polls to decide on city council members in runoff elections across North Texas.

The runoff elections were triggered for local elections in which no candidate received more than 50% of the vote in the May 3 election.

In the District 11 race, Jeff Kitner faced off against Bill Roth. In the May 3 election, Roth received 48.36% of the vote (2,992 votes) to Kitner's 45% (2,782 votes).

Election Night Final with a turnout of 7.85% of voters:

- **Roth with 53.78% - 4,093 votes**
- Kitner with 46.22% - 3,517 votes

City of Dallas >>>

Code Ordinance Reminders:

PARKING: Motor vehicles must be parked on an approved surface, which includes concrete, asphalt, or 6" of gravel with a border. It is a violation to park a vehicle on the lawn. Additionally, parking on the street, headed the wrong direction, often gets ticketed in our neighborhood.

PET WASTE: You are required to remove immediately, any feces created by your dog on public property or private property not owned, leased, or controlled by you.

GARAGE SALES: Two garage sales are allowed each year per property. The sale may not last longer than 3 days. A permit is required though the Dallas City Hall website. Advertising signs may only be placed on the property where the sale is occurring.
